This year, just on 100 students completed their Mind Matters projects. The projects were marked over 4 days by Mrs Bush, Ms Tucker, Mrs McGufficke, Mr Pinkerton, Mrs Thornton, Mrs Quee, Mrs Gould, Mrs Lattimore, Mrs Jensen and Ms Gorton.

On the left you will see the range of topics students chose - there is much variety this year!

Feedback from students via the evaluation sheets tells us that students found this a challenging yet rewarding task on the whole.

Students feel generally that they are more aware of their learning styles and that one of the most important things they learnt was to deal with time management.

Recommendations from highly successful students were to:

- Choose a topic early and stick with it
- Plan early and organise your time
- Work consistently
- Start early and finish early to leave time for presentation and proofing

Scores ranged from 22 to 143, with the majority of students scoring above 90.

Those students who indicated they were not happy



with their final outcome reflected mostly about time management being poor, not understanding the task fully and not seeking help to clarify their understanding.

The staff at Wauchope High involved in the Mind Matters projects this year would like to congratulate and thank all the students for what they achieved—both in the creation of tasks and in the understandings they will take into their next level of schooling. We thank parents for their support, enthusiasm and hard work in bringing these projects to fruition and participating in the presentation process.
