This year saw Year 8 take on a whole new challenge in the form of a blank grid! In previous years students were provided with

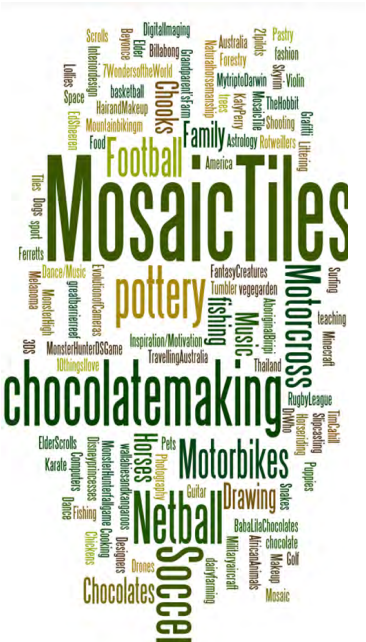
specific tasks to complete within a Pirozzo Grid. In 2015 we upped the ante & students responded with varying degrees of success. During terms 1 & 2 students were explicitly taught about Gardner's brain theory of multiple intelligences. They also worked with Bloom's taxonomy to encourage them to work with the higher order thinking skills of analysing, evaluating and creating.

Students were then encouraged to create their own tasks within a blank grid. They did have access to last year's grid and many students used this either in total or as a support. The standard again varied but overall the bar was high. As expected there was less consistency in marks allocated across markers due to the change in the way students

tackled the grid. It is always the process in this program that is the most important.

It is recommended that students consider most important the verbal and written feedback they have received rather than the final mark—which is really just a guide to the amount of work completed.

Next year the program is set for another overhaul and staff have been actively engaging with student feedback to develop and improve the program so that it reflects the changing nature of learning and best equips students for 21st century learning.
