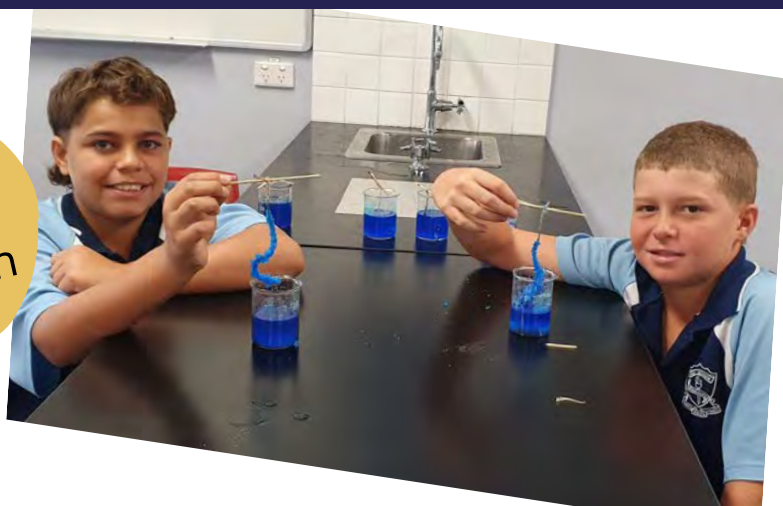
Well done girls on a great effort. Next year should be more kind to us.

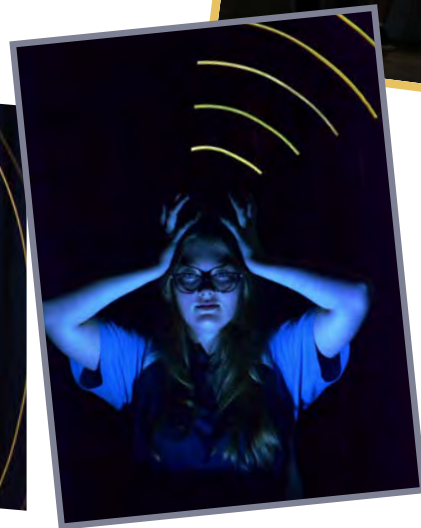

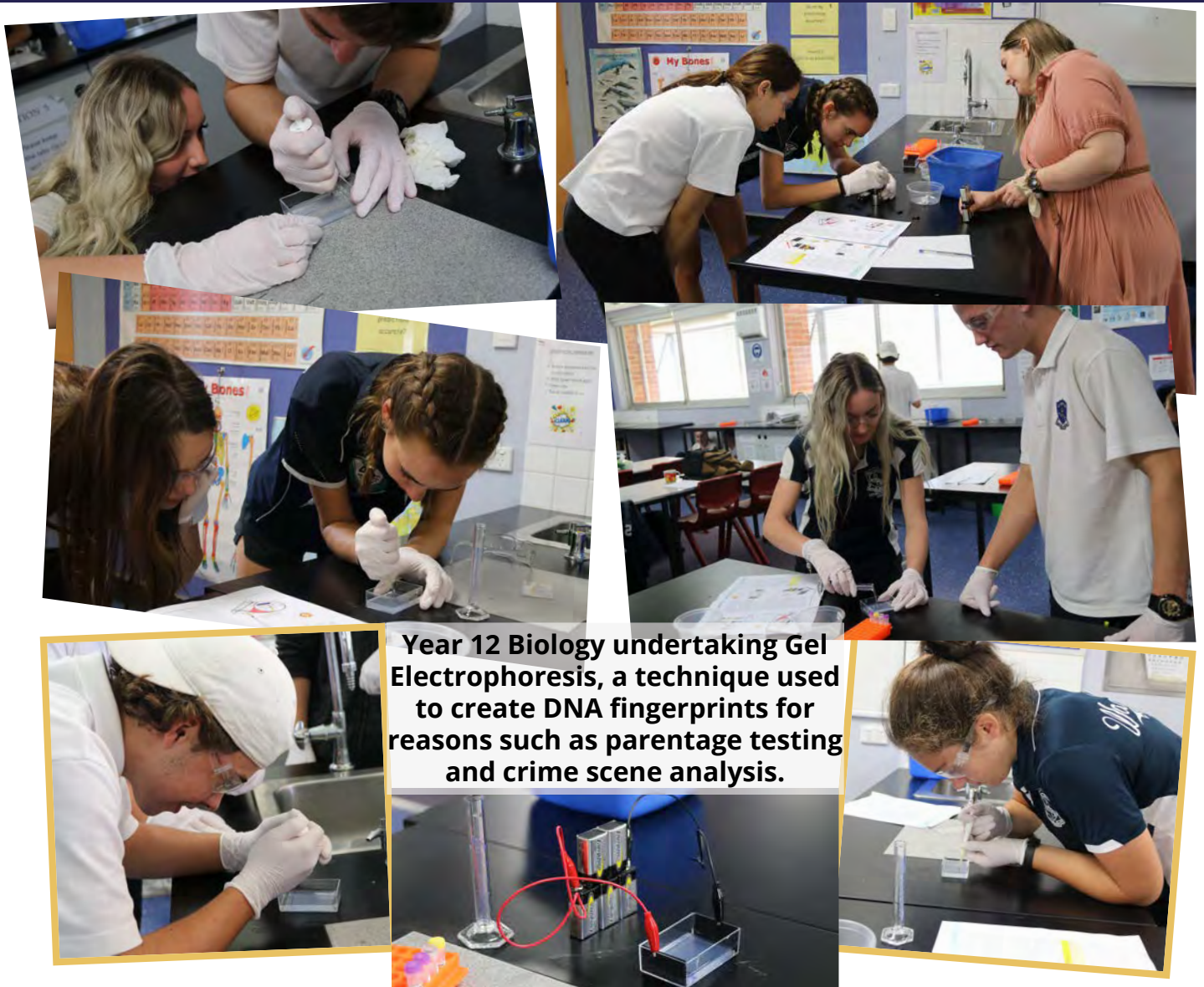


# YEAR 8 GEOGRAPHY

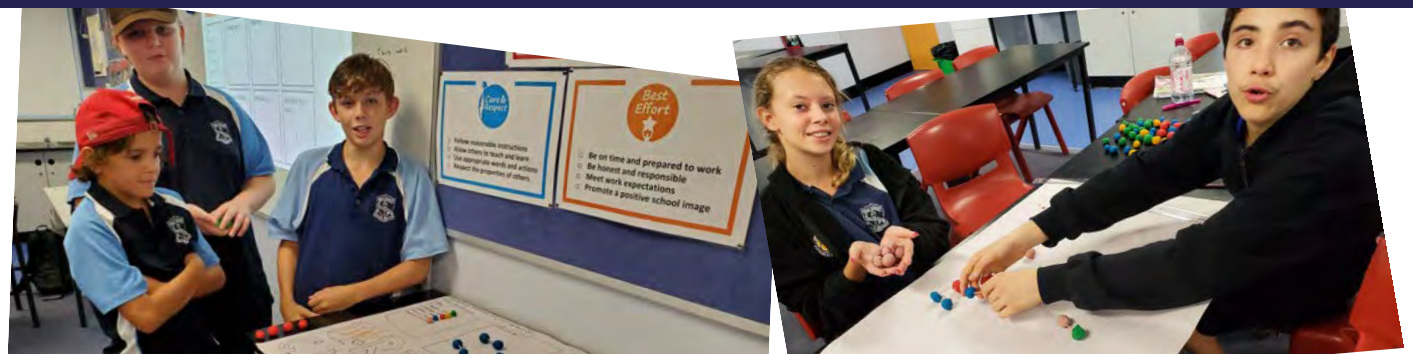

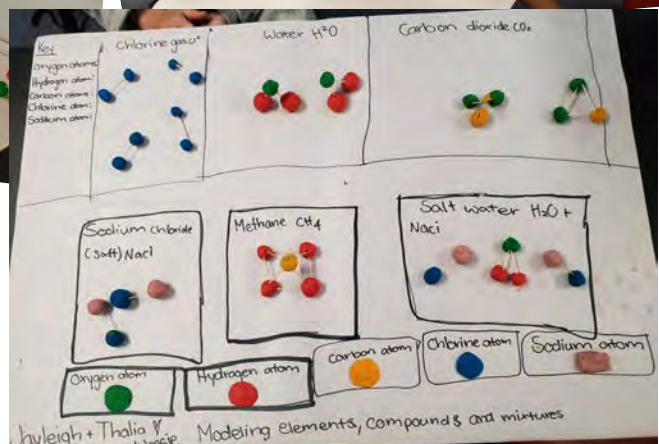

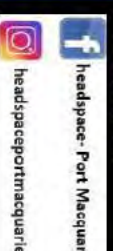
