

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CAPA WEEK



Congratulations to all the students, teachers and support staff who worked tirelessly to present an outstanding week of the Arts.







The 2024 Wauchope High Photography Competition saw amazing photos submitted! We had a record number of entries in all three categories with a wide range of subjects.





FREE LAYER HENS

We run a free range, pasture raised egg laying system at the School Farm. Our current laying hens are ready to move on to new homes. These hens are 3-4 years old and are either Isa Brown layers that we bought or crossbred hens that we hatched out ourselves. These hens are still producing eggs regularly and would suit anyone wanting some birds for their backyard. There are over 20 birds available. We are looking to give these birds to people who are in a position to care for them and are happy to donate two or more birds to anyone who would like them.


