Together with our Aboriginal high school students, they participated in a range of cultural activities including cultural games, sharing language and knowledge, cooking, agriculture and marine studies.

All of our students enjoyed their day connecting to culture, building connections and becoming more comfortable and confident in the high school environment. It was a wonderful day, and we look forward to more days like this as our Birpai Buddies program continues.





WOMEN'S FESTIVAL





Our girls attended the Nyiirun Djiyagan Wakulda Women's Festival hosted by Djiyagan Dhanbaan (strong sister movement support group) at the Birpai Local Aboriginal Land Council. Djiyagan Dhanbaan are an Aboriginal women's group that promotes the revival of culture through language and practices, selfempowerment, leadership and self-care.

Our students indulged in a beautiful day connecting with our community. They embraced the opportunity to immerse themselves in traditional practices, from learning about cultural storytelling and art to participating in workshops that highlighted the strength and significance of women in their communities. Our Wauchope High School 'Yapun Yapun' dancers proudly showcased their culture at the Women's Festival, performing traditional dances in ochre. Their movements, rich with meaning, connected them to their ancestors and Country, creating a powerful and moving experience. Through these experiences, they deepened their understanding of cultural identity, fostering a stronger connection to their roots while sharing in the collective spirit of empowerment.

WHY ATTENDANCE MATTERS



We want to do all we can to be sure your child achieves their potential and enjoys being in school.

We know that school is the best place to learn. By attending school every day your child will get the most out of their learning and improve their career and life options.

When your child is absent it is important you let the school know, including the reason why, on the day or the day before. This helps make sure we know where our students are and offer support for you and your family if needed.



If you are having trouble getting your child to school every day or on time, please talk to our school staff so we can work together, because every day counts.

Missing a day here or there may not seem like much, but absences add up and can negatively impact your child's learning and wellbeing. When your child misses one day a week that's 40 days of school and 8 weeks of learning in one year. Over an entire school journey this adds up to 2.5 years of lost learning.

Please contact the school if your child needs to miss school for any reason, so we can plan continued support for your child's learning and wellbeing.
