How lucky are we being right on the river here! Year 9 managed to get in some fishing early in the morning before the heat struck and year 10 got our remote control sail boats into the water for the first time!

# YEAR 12 CHEMISTRY EXCURSION

Last Friday, year 12 Chemistry students accompanied by Mr. Highland, embarked on a threehour journey to the Orica Ammonia Plant. This facility produces an impressive 300 tonnes of ammonia, primarily used in fertilisers, and 400 tonnes of ammonium nitrate, which supports coal mining operations in western NSW.

The visit began with an engaging lecture outlining the plant's operations and some remarkable



facts about its scale. For instance, the plant uses 20,000 litres of water daily and accounts for 15% of the natural gas consumed in NSW.

The tour continued with a guided walk around the plant, where we learned that their air compressor boasts more engine power than all the cars in a Formula 1 race combined. We even had the unique experience of peeking into their furnace, which operates at a scorching 1300°C— definitely a moment that warmed more than just our curiosity!

Overall, it was an educational and enjoyable day that brought our classroom learning to life.

Held at the Laurieton Services Club, this event provided a meaningful platform to celebrate and share the richness of Indigenous culture with a broader audience.





### **GETTING TO SCHOOL BY BUS IN 2025**

Will your child be catching the bus to school next year? Applications are now open for a Bus Travel Pass. As it's a busy time of year, we highly recommend you make this application before the end of the year. It's also good to check the bus timetable to make your child's journey to school as easy as possible. Here is how it works:

#### **Bus passes**

- All students catching the bus in 2025 will need a school travel pass.
- Under the School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS), eligible students can apply for free or subsided travel between home and school.
- For more information about the School Student Transport Scheme and how to apply for a school travel pass, visit <u>https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/#/</u> from a desktop computer.

#### **Bus timetables**

Busways is the school bus operator that runs your schools' bus services. To find your child's school bus timetable visit the Busways website by using the following steps:

- 1.Go to <u>busways.com.au/nsw</u>
- 2. Click on 'school services' in the navigation bar and then proceed to 'school timetables'
- 3. Enter the school's name in the field that says 'enter a school name'
- 4. Select the school's name and the timetable should open on your device. If you are unable to find or search for the school's name, use the drop-down menus on the same web page to find the school.
- 5. Once the timetable is opened, you will be able to identify which school bus services are available in your area for your child to use.
